

INTRODUCTION

The Housing Executive, which is responsible for the provision and management of accommodation for the Irish Traveller community in Northern Ireland, commissioned a survey to inform its Irish Traveller Housing Strategy and Needs Assessment.

Interviews with respondents representing 540 Irish Traveller households, comprising a total of 1,628 individuals, were carried out between May 2019 and January 2020.

In May 2020 we published the findings of the research, which provide an updated and robust insight into the housing circumstances and preferences of Irish Travellers in Northern Ireland and important evidence to inform our Irish Travellers Accommodation Strategy 2020-25.

PRESENTATION

We have produced infographics for Northern Ireland and each Local Government District, with the exception of North Down and Ards and Causeway Coast and Glens Borough Councils; this is due to the small number of Irish Travellers identified and interviewed in these areas. Mid and East Antrim and Antrim and Newtownabbey Borough Councils have been combined due to the number of Irish Travellers identified and interviewed in each area.

POTENTIAL NEWLY-FORMING HOUSEHOLDS

The research also looked at the potential for newly-forming households.

Respondents were asked if any member of their current household was likely to seek their own accommodation in the next five years and, if yes, at what location. Almost one-fifth (19%) expected a household member to seek their own accommodation within the next five years.

The Northern Ireland figure suggests around 165 household members would form a total of approximately 150 households; the council infographics provide a breakdown for each area.
