

# Fuel poverty workshop Feedback survey

On 21 May 2019 the Housing Executive held 2 workshops for users of the Northern Ireland fuel poverty statistics, which are produced as part of the Northern Ireland House Condition Survey. Each workshop comprised 3 presentations by the Building Research Establishment (BRE):

- Measuring and estimating fuel poverty
- Fuel poverty ready reckoner; and
- 2017 & 2018 estimates of fuel poverty

Following the workshops, delegates were invited to complete an online feedback survey. The findings of the survey will be used to help the Housing Executive plan future workshops and events. A summary of the findings is presented below.

#### Notes:

- This summary report represents the combined views of delegates from the morning and afternoon sessions.
- Twenty delegates attended the fuel poverty workshops and fourteen completed the feedback survey.
- Some respondents' comments are not reported due to small numbers, but the Housing Executive will use them when planning future workshops.

Key findings:

Overall, respondents gave very positive feedback on all aspects of the fuel poverty workshop.

- All respondents enjoyed the workshop and found it useful.
- All respondents learned something new from the workshops.
- All respondents would recommend the workshop to a colleague.
- The topics respondents would most like to see covered in future workshops are energy efficiency and the Decent Homes Standard.
