We received your request on 08 January 2024 for the following information:

1 Can NIHE please provide a breakdown of the number of people who applied for emergency accommodation over the last 5 years? (Including the most recent data available).

- 3 Can you break the information down for each year to show the nationality of applicants and how many applied/were successful in each council area?
- 4 If possible, can you also provide a breakdown of those in emergency accommodation over that period based on religion?

The Housing Executive has taken references to emergency accommodation to refer to temporary accommodation. In Northern Ireland the Housing (NI) Order 1988 (as amended) identifies the Northern Ireland Housing Executive as the agency tasked with responding to homelessness. The Order places a statutory duty on the Housing Executive to provide interim and/or permanent accommodation for certain homeless households, dependent upon investigations and assessment of their circumstances.

In order to be "accepted" as statutorily homeless, a household must meet the four tests of:

- Eligibility
- Homelessness
- Priority Need
- Intentionality

Any household that meets these four tests will be accepted as a 'Full Duty Applicant' (FDA) and will be owed a full housing duty. The full housing duty includes ensuring that accommodation is made available for the household as well as the provision of temporary accommodation where necessary and assistance with the protection of the household's belongings.

The table in response to Question 2 details the number of placements in temporary accommodation provided by the Housing Executive for the past 5 years broken down by Council. It should be noted that the Council area refers to the area to which the Housing Executive presented as homeless.

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## 2 Can you note the number of successful applicants for each year and for council area?

The table below details the number of placements in temporary accommodation provided by the Housing Executive for the past 5 years broken down by Council. It should be noted the Council area refers to the area to which the household as presented as homeless and some households will have received more than one placement.
