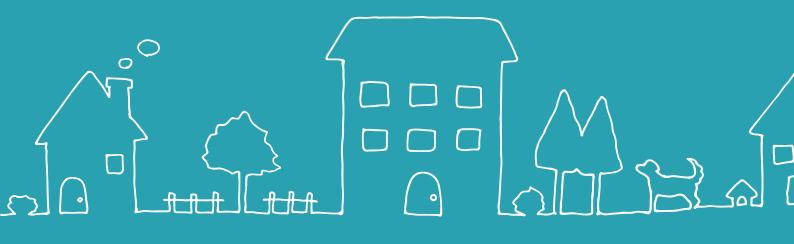

Domestic Abuse Year 2 Actions

The Housing Executive published the Domestic Abuse Action Plan in December 2024 with the action plan outlining intended actions covering a three year period up to the conclusion of the current Homelessness Strategy 2022-27 in March 2027. The Year 2 Actions build on progress delivered during Year 1 where key achievements included:

- Engagement with the voluntary and community sector to increase understanding of
 difficult to reach groups and their experiences of domestic abuse. This has included
 engagement with representatives from NI Youth Forum, NW Migrants Forum, Rural
 Community Network, Hourglass, VOYPIC, CRJI, MAP, Rainbow project and Disability
 Forum to gain an understanding of the specific challenges their client group face and
 ways in which the Housing Executive could help them engage better.
- 22 members of staff completing training to become a Domestic Abuse Advocate with a further 18 due to complete their training in the first quarter of 2025/26.
- A review of all training packages with updates reflecting the changes in legislation that have guided the Housing Executive's response to domestic abuse. A new bespoke training course for assessing officers was developed and at the conclusion of Year 1 of the Domestic Abuse Action Plan, almost 500 staff had received the training.
- There has been a significant focus on increasing awareness and update of the Sanctuary Scheme. This has involved promotion of the Sanctuary Scheme during training and increased engagement with the PSNI, including the development of a referral form which will be implemented by the start of May 2025. This will provide further support and assistance to those experiencing domestic abuse.
- The Housing Executive has worked with Women's Aid to review the existing protocol with a revised protocol having been launched in November 2025.

The development of the Year 2 actions seeks to improve accountability for our partners with the provision of clear milestones that will assist stakeholders in monitoring progress of the action plan.

The Domestic Abuse Action Plan supports delivery of the Homelessness Strategy 2022-27 and both will continue to be guided by the development of annual action plans that will support the Housing Executive and our partners in achieving our vision, aims and objectives.



Vision and Aim

The vision of 'Ending Homelessness Together' and aim of 'Wherever possible homelessness should be prevented, if homelessness cannot be prevented it should be rare, brief and non-recurring' is supported by three key objectives, each with priority actions that will be reviewed on an annual basis.

The overall strategy and Domestic Abuse Action Plan have been developed around three key objectives:

- Prioritise homelessness prevention;
- Address homelessness by providing settled, appropriate accommodation and support;
- Support customers to transition from homelessness into settled accommodation.

Additionally, the Homelessness Strategy 2022-27 is guided by a number of principles and enablers as below and these will have a key role in supporting the implementation of the Domestic Abuse Action Plan.

Outcomes and Milestones

While the objectives of the Homelessness Strategy will continue to be guided by a range of outcomes and associated indicators, the Domestic Abuse Year 2 actions highlight a desired outcome aligned to each specific action. The inclusion of an outcome specific to each action seeks to consider findings from the Northern Ireland Audit Office (NIAO) Report on Homelessness which noted a need to consider how actions have contributed to measurable homelessness outcomes for service users. In addition, milestones have also been included to each of the 16 actions which will act as key markers of progress to ensure we are achieving the overall outcome. All of the actions in Year 2 are directly carried over from those completed in Year 1.

In addition, we will set up bi-annual meetings to gain an understanding of the frequency and nature of queries the advocates are receiving. This in turn will inform the levels of awareness of the advocate service across the organisation.	By 30th June 2025 we will increase the number of domestic abuse advocates to 40. By 30th September 2025 the first meeting of advocates will have taken place. Outcomes NIHE will have sufficient domestic abuse advocates to support all the staff in the organisation and we will have a better understanding of the demand for the service and awareness levels.

Milestones By 31st August 2025 we will have established a small working group to agree a suitable week and plan how it will evolve. By 31st March 2026 the appropriate week will have been agreed and a draft programme of events planned. Outcome The general public will have an increased awareness of domestic abuse and the various agencies that are available to provide support.

Milestone There are no milestones applicable to the delivery of this action as the outcome of the review has not yet been published. Where appropriate, milestones will be added throughout the course of the year. Outcome An improved MARAC process that will be more effective in minimising risk to those experiencing domestic abuse.

Action 16 Lead Partner: Housing Executive	We will consider means by which we can address perpetrator behaviour.	 Milestones By end 30th September 2025 we will have reviewed NI legislation to identify if there is any scope within it which would give NIHE powers to remove convicted perpetrators from NIHE tenancies. By 31st December 2025 we will have researched means by which social housing providers in other jurisdictions address perpetrator behaviour. By 31st March 2026 we will have drafted a summary of our findings and recommendations for addressing perpetrator behaviour. Outcome Improved housing outcomes for those experiencing domestic abuse.
