We received your request on 06 June 2024 for the following information:

 Can you clarify if any payments made to housing association 'intermediate rent' schemes or similar may be counted as Private Rented Sector?
In order to amend any inaccuracies, we would be grateful for a corrected set of figures for all of the years referenced (2012/13 – 2022/23), with housing benefit payments to housing association social homes excluded from the 'housing benefit payments to private rental sector' totals. If it would be possible to send an explainer of what the amended totals include, that would be helpful, to avoid further misunderstanding.

Your request has been handled under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA).

Our response

- Intermediate Rent is a new housing rental model for the local housing market in Northern Ireland. There are currently no Intermediate Rent homes available to rent. Therefore, the Housing Benefit payments detailed below for the Private Rented Sector do not include Intermediate Rent homes.
- 2. Please see the table below for the split of Housing Benefit payments to Housing Associations and to the Private Rented Sector by the Northern Ireland Housing Executive from 2016/17 to 2023/24.
