Year 4 Action Plan

The Housing Executive published the Homelessness Strategy 2022-27 on 23rd March 2022 alongside its Year 1 Action Plan. To date we have subsequently published a Year 2 and Year 3 Action Plan. The Year 3 Action Plan details planned actions from April 2024 to March 2025. During the third year of the Homelessness Strategy some of our key achievements have been;

- We progressed engagement with the Education Sector, by co-ordinating youth networking events and successfully delivered our first homelessness awareness pilot in Erne Integrated College, Enniskillen. The Housing Executive have also been engaging with the Department of Education in raising awareness of the new RAISE Programme and promoting further engagement with local agencies.
- During the year we published the Housing Executive's first Domestic Abuse Action Plan and Youth Homelessness Action Plan.
- We delivered a number of successful awareness raising campaigns. This included a range of events and activities that took place during Homelessness Awareness Week 2024, which were organised by the Homelessness Local Area Groups and Local Area Teams. The Housing Executive also took part in Ormeau Park Run, during No More Week to raise awareness of domestic abuse.
- We worked together with key partners to listen to those with lived experience of homelessness to assist in the development of a Lived Experience Programme in Northern Ireland.
- We have continued to work closely with the Centre for Homelessness Impact in improving our homelessness data with the continued development of the 'Ending Homelessness Framework for Northern Ireland' and improving our understanding of temporary accommodation costs, with the report regarding Value for Money in relation to temporary accommodation.

We have worked together with our partners across the sector through the various structures including the Central Homelessness Forum and our Homelessness Local Area Groups throughout the third year of the Homelessness Strategy with our vision of 'Ending Homelessness Together' at the forefront of all of our efforts.

The development of the Year 4 Action Plan continues to be guided by our partners and in line with the significant work undertaken in the first three years of the Strategy. It is important to reflect that several actions will be carried forward to our Year 4 Action plan as the work is still ongoing and the action has now either directly carried forward or evolved slightly and has been reworded accordingly to ensure the action builds on progress delivered during the first three years.

The Housing Executive recognises the importance of listening to those who have lived experience of homelessness, and a and as part of the Housing Executives commitment, a set of Lived Experience Groups were organised by Homeless Connect to understand individual's views on the development of a Lived Experience Programme and help to inform the future development of a programme in Northern Ireland. The views of those individuals have supported the planning and development of a Lived Experience Programme. The Housing

Executive has continued to work with key partners in seeking funding in order to begin implementation of a programme during 2025/26.

In consideration of the work carried out to date, it has therefore led to the continuation of the following actions in the Year 4 Action Plan;

- Action 17 'We will continue work on the further development of our Lived Experience Programme, building on the work carried out within our Year 1, 2 and 3 Action Plans. We will begin implementation of the Lived Experience Programme during 2025/26.'
- Action 18 'As part of shaping the development of a Lived Experience Programme we will continue to host Lived Experience Group meetings over the course of 2025/26 and the format of these groups will be considered as the Lived Experience Programme evolves.'

In addition, the Housing Executive will continue engagement with the Education Sector. The specific actions outlined in the Year 2 and Year 3 Action Plans were informed by those with lived experience of homelessness, who highlighted the importance of further education and awareness of homelessness from an early age, investment in young people in terms of early intervention, including efforts to improve education and awareness of homelessness especially in primary and secondary school education. The work to date has led to the evolvement and continuation of the following action;

 Action 33 - 'We will continue to roll out the Homelessness Awareness Sessions within schools across Northern Ireland. While the primary focus will be homelessness awareness, we will involve a range of partners to highlight the availability of support services and careers within the housing and homelessness sector.'

The Homelessness Strategy 2022-27 continues to be guided by the development of annual action plans that will support the Housing Executive and our partners in achieving our vision, aims and objectives.



Vision and Aim

The vision of 'Ending Homelessness Together' and aim of 'Wherever possible homelessness should be prevented, if homelessness cannot be prevented it should be rare, brief and non-recurring' is supported by three key objectives, each with priority actions that will be reviewed on an annual basis.

Principles, Objectives and Enablers

At the core of this strategy, there are a number of guiding principles that will underpin our approach to both the development and delivery of homelessness services throughout its lifespan. These principles, which are outlined below, have been co-produced with the wider homelessness sector and will be incorporated across each theme to achieve our vision of 'Ending Homelessness Together'.

This strategy has been developed around three key objectives:

- Address homelessness by providing settled, appropriate accommodation and support;

Enablers



The Homelessness Strategy will continue to evolve based on experiential evidence, emerging pressures and priorities and it is our intention to work towards the defined success criteria outlined in this document by developing the 'enablers' and pulling all levers available to us. These enablers are as critical to the success of the strategy as the delivery of the objectives themselves.

Year 4 Action Plan

With the enablers being critical to the success of the strategy, the Year 3 actions have once again been developed around the enablers and the three objectives. The table below outlines actions that the Housing Executive and our partners will seek to deliver over the course of 2024/25.

As part of the consultation on the draft Homelessness Strategy 2022-27 a number of stakeholders noted the need for an easy read version of the Homelessness Strategy 2022-27 and this action plan seeks to provide a concise summary of what we and our partners will do to address homelessness in Northern Ireland.

The Housing Executive recognises the funding challenges associated with delivering some of the actions outlined in the action plan below, and therefore to help our partners and those with lived experience of homelessness to understand the challenges that the Housing Executive has in delivering some of these actions it is important that we highlight the actions that can be and will be delivered, but also the actions that we would like to deliver but are subject to funding. To reflect this each of the actions under the enablers and objectives have been broken into the two following sections.

- Actions that will be delivered as part of the Year 4 Action Plan This section
 includes actions that can be completed without the need for additional funding and/
 or resources. It is therefore anticipated that delivery of these actions have minimal
 associated risks.
- Actions subject to securing funding This section includes actions that we would like to deliver during 2025/26 however, they are reliant on securing funding and therefore there are associated delivery risks.

Evolution of Actions

In addition to the above categorisation of actions, each of the 44 actions in the Year 4 Action Plan detail whether the action is:

- Carry Over Action This reflects an action which is directly carried over from the Year 3
 Action Plan
- Amended Action This reflects an action which builds on progress delivered in the Year 3 Action Plan and has therefore been amended to reflect an updated aspiration in terms of delivery.
- New Action This reflects a new action that has not been part of the Year 3 Action Plan.

This categorisation is listed in italics below each action number.

Outcomes and Milestones

While the objectives of the Homelessness Strategy will continue to be guided by a range of outcomes and associated indicators, the Year 4 Action Plan highlights a desired outcome aligned to each specific action. The inclusion of an outcome specific to each action seeks to consider findings from the Northern Ireland Audit Office (NIAO) Report on Homelessness which noted a need to consider how actions have contributed to measurable homelessness outcomes for service users.

In addition, milestones have also been included to each of the 44 actions which will act as key markers of progress to ensure we are achieving the overall outcome.
