# Request for data (numbers/ characteristics) for homelessness for the financial year 2021/22

## **Request:**

Please may I request the following information for the financial year 21/22:

- 1) Data (numbers/characteristics) collected on who turns down support offered by local authority outreach teams. This could include demographic/circumstantial information (i.e. why they refuse/where they are staying) on who disengages and the number of people
- 2) Data (numbers/characteristics) collected on people who stay in squats, including the number of people who are arrested or cautioned for squatting in the local authority
- 3) Data (numbers/characteristics) collected on people residing in unconventional accommodation types such as temporary structures
- 4) A breakdown of where people are counted in local rough sleeping snapshots (e.g., cars, sheds, doorways) and the numbers
- 5) Data collected on the number of people staying in overcrowded and concealed households and any accompanying demographic information such as sex, age, ethnicity.
- 6) Data (numbers/characteristics) collected on the number of people who "sofa surf" or stay temporarily in the homes of others.

### **Clarification:**

I mean temporary structures such as tents or street shelters and also inadequate structures such as sheds etc. By concealed households I am referring to households living with another household in overcrowded conditions.

- Overcrowding points will be awarded to an Applicant if, in the view of the Designated Officer, that Applicant's current accommodation does not have the number and size of bedrooms reasonably required by the Applicant's household and all others residing in that accommodation.
- Waiting List data is a snapshot of the waiting list as it was on the last day of the specified quarter in this case 31/03/22.
- Age, sex and marital status relate to the age, sex and marital status of the 1st applicant in the household. Religion, Ethnic Origin and Nationality reflects the Religion, Ethnic Origin and Nationality of the entire household.
- <10 are cases where numbers are less than 10.
- UK GDPR and Data Protection Act 2018 It is important to note the GDPR & Data Protection Act 2018 regarding the potential risk of identifying individuals and individual households. Guidance from NISRA suggests that equality monitoring information should not be disclosed in sensitive cases where individuals or individual households could be identified. Also the Information Commissioner's Office (ICO) 'Anonymisation: Managing Data Protection Risk' Code of Practice states 'where less than 10 responses have been given to an answer that identifies something factual, all variables relating to that question have been suppressed'.

However, 'it should be noted that attitudinal questions are not bound by this rule, in addition to responses of 'Don't know', 'Refused', 'Other' or similar. As the information provided is considered sensitive some statistical disclosure controls may have been placed on the tables with the omission of data in cases where there are less than ten Applicants.
